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Hello from Mountain youth!

Mountain Youth celebrated 20 years of community impact in 2021. We have enjoyed two decades of seeking input from the community, convening partners, addressing significant needs and strengths facing local youth, and mobilizing to provide activities to young people and families. Youth advising and leadership opportunities along with diverse family engagement have grown significantly. Realizing the continued reality of a global pandemic, we facilitated in-person gatherings when possible and maintained critical connections with youth and families in various platforms through 2021. Youth elevated their voice to lead dozens of events and projects for their peers, and the Spanish-speaking community identified and led dozens of family engagement events. The biennial Healthy Kids Colorado Survey administration engaged middle and high schoolers from 12 schools. The information gained from this survey helps to inform programming and bring critical funding to our community. Through the activities and nimble support during our twentieth year, Mountain Youth remained steadfast in fulfilling our vision of seeing all youth thrive.

LIFE SKILLS FOR STUDENTS

Mountain Youth offers a comprehensive life skills curriculum to 5th - 12th grade students in all schools in the Eagle River Valley. These programs address issues facing local youth, such as preventing substance abuse, building healthy relationships, coping with adversities, and improving communication. The program teaches youth the skills necessary to handle difficult situations and avoid risky behaviors.

Parents note that understanding adolescent brain development and improving communication techniques have been beneficial to building connection as a family. The families find that sharing openly in a safe and supportive environment helps reduce family stress and increases patience and more active listening. Families are united for half a day, without phones and distractions, with an empathetic facilitator and take home important tools that benefit their families. Many lessons are learned, and tears are often shed between bouts of laughter.

EAT CHAT PARENT

Eat Chat Parent hosts thought-provoking discussions on topics ranging from LGBTQ+ inclusion to fueling mental health solutions. Navigating COVID challenges with flexibility and innovation, Eat Chat Parent events were hosted in-person and virtually. Additionally, Move Chat Parent launched in 2021, offering opportunities for physical movement while simultaneously learning critical skills in a fun setting. There were numerous discussions in which youth and adults engaged in conversation regarding mental health pressures. Mountain Youth continues to research current family education subjects to provide the most meaningful parent education to the community.

Eat Chat Parent is a true gift to our valley. They bring in number 1 New York Times bestselling authors, ESPN reporters, and local mental and physical health experts. Eat Chat Parent events create a safe place for us to discuss tough topics and learn strategies on how to help ourselves and our youth.

APRENDIENDO JUNTOS (LEARNING TOGETHER)

In 2021, a series of Spanish learning opportunities covered topics including Healthy Relationships, The Basics of Finance, Mindfulness and Stress Reduction. These groups provided learning opportunities and the chance to create new and supportive relationships.

72 women attended 6 women's groups I really loved the women's group. These topics were incredibly helpful for me to be aware of and to know the best practices to help my children if they ever encounter issues. In addition, I built friendships with people from my own community and learned about the services and resources that multiple organizations in the community have to offer.

TU GUIA

Tu Guia ("Your Guide") is a youth-led and adult-supported program developed for local high school and college students to support younger students in Eagle County who may need academic assistance. Tutors create the academic lessons based on the students' needs with a strong social-emotional foundation. The goal is to increase students' individual academic levels while building critical life skills. In addition, tutors assist the students' parents and caregivers in learning how



to best support their children on their own in the future. It is a multigenerational program, which makes it unique from other tutoring programs.

In my time as a tutor, I made connections with families that I still have to this day. During this time of COVID I can say that some of my most valuable teaching lessons were not just on how to read, but lessons that taught both of us how to cope with emotions like fear, sadness, anger, anxiety; emotions that are often overlooked in children. Although our tutors are still in high school, we are making a difference because we are providing academic support to these students while also becoming role models for the children. We support the parents to be able to guide their children later on. The work that we are doing through this program is life-changing!

VALLEY'S VOICE

Youth programming grew to new heights and more diverse opportunities in 2021. Valley's Voice introduced Youthapalooza, For Youth By Youth events, and Middle School Nights to offer opportunities to try new activities, go out to socialize with friends and meet someone new. Events increased in participation, involved new groups of yo

Valley's Voice members responded overwhelmingly (**100%**) that their work with the community is meaningful.

Events increased in participation, involved new groups of youth, and thrived on the passion that youth had for them. Passion Project brainstorming and work continues for high school Valley's Voice as students look to address and prevent youth challenges.

COMMUNITIES THAT CARE

Communities That Care (CTC) achieved significant progress in Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion in 2021 by establishing the coalition's work on these values. Two Positive Youth Development (PYD) training sessions were conducted as a result of CTC efforts, including the first Bilingual PYD.

CTC engaged 75 members of local organizations and businesses in its strategy teams and workgroups as well as youth from local middle and high schools.



SAFE DRIVING

Mountain Youth's safe driving work is focused on reducing impaired and distracted driving rates. In 2021, Mountain Youth focused on educating parents and youth through a variety of strategies:

- Presenting Graduated Driver's Licensing Laws (GDL) education in person and virtually
- Partnering with Colorado Young Driver's Alliance to develop a statewide GDL toolkit
- Collaborating with Vail Police Department to host responsible server training and conduct educational compliance checks with over 40 alcohol retailers in Vail
- Partnering with local law enforcement agencies to complete bar checks and Driving Under the Influence (DUI) enforcement
- Launching Safe Driving Media Campaigns: bus advertisements, community signage and safe driving CO Instagram page
- Implementing Safe Rides Program

HEALTHY KIDS COLORADO SURVEY

2021 marked the 9th local Healthy Kids Colorado Survey administration since 2007
